### ELA "Who Am I?"

Students in 7th grade ELA have been busy learning about sentence structure this month. The students enjoyed moving around and interviewing each other as they asked prompting questions to determine what sentence type they had on their forehead.



### **Scale Drawing Project - 7th Grade Accelerated Math**

The 7th grade accelerated math classes have been working on their Geometry Cycle, during this cycle they learned about scale drawing, area of circles, and volume. Mrs. Smith's classes converted the geometry concepts to a real-world problem by creating birdhouses. The first step included researching birds in our area. Next, the students created a scale drawing of what they wanted their birdhouse to look like according to the bird they selected. Once they had their scale with a key the students transformed their birdhouses onto the wood. Mrs. Smith cut all of their pieces according to their drawings. The final step included constructing and decorating the birdhouses. Congratulations to Mrs. Smith and the 7th-grade students who completed this project! Mrs. Smith believes that the students learned many skills that they would not have learned by just solving problems on paper.



### Sixth Grade Learns about the Impact of 9-11

In Mrs. Greene's Class, small groups traveled throughout the room engaging in different activities regarding 9/11. Students gained a better understanding of the impact of 9/11 as they analyzed a minute-by-minute timeline, read an article from an eyewitness, and watched a video from kids just like them, who were not alive during 9/11.

ELA students learned about text structure in a fun escape room activity. Students rushed to determine the correct text structures for several articles in an effort to find the right puzzles and escape Mrs. Greene's room!



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


#### The Dawson County Health Department is coming to a school near you! \*\*Help Fight the Flu and get your child vaccinated!\*\*

A message for our Assistant Principal, Josh Lipps



Over the summer, I had lunch with one of my longtime friends from Ohio. We have been friends since 1st grade. Whenever we get together, we share some of our favorite stories from school. Inevitably, one of us says something to the effect of, "I'm glad cell phones and social media weren't around to record that." I think all of us who are at or over a certain age have said that at some point as well.

Unfortunately, our students today are growing up in a world full of social media and it is causing a number of issues. Don't get me wrong, social media can have its positives. It is a great way to communicate with friends and family, celebrate each other, and provide important announcements. I love seeing fun pictures and videos, encouraging posts, and uplifting quotes. The thing to remember is that these are the actions of responsible individuals. Children have not necessarily learned all the social and emotional skills necessary to use social media responsibly. With 81% of teens on social media (according to the Pew Research Center), it explains why we see so many negative effects in their lives.

We understand that parenting in the digital age can be scary with the potential of so many issues arising from the various social media platforms:

- Exposure to harmful or inappropriate content.
- Cyberbullying and the increased risk factors for depression and anxiety that can come from it.
- Dangerous people trying to contact your child.
- Privacy concerns with them sharing personal data which could lead to identity theft.
- Interference with sleep, academic performance, and family activities.

All of these dangers exist on multiple platforms with Snapchat, TikTok, and Instagram being some of the more popular and dangerous ones.

So, what's a parent to do? How can you protect your child's mental, emotional, and physical health if they have access to these apps?

- Be aware and place limitations. Be aware of the apps your child uses; they can be clever with hiding them. Be aware of who they are communicating with and what they are communicating. Set limitations with the amount of time they spend on social media. An example is no screens after 9:00 p.m. It is not like when we were kids and said something we regretted to a friend. If it is put out on social media, then it is there for everyone to see and it exists forever.
- 2. Educate and communicate. Educate and model for them responsible use of social media and technology in general. Communicate why you are not allowing them to have unrestricted access to a phone or certain apps. Let them know the real concerns you have and how this protects them.
- 3. Know you're not alone. Every year we instruct your child on responsible use of the school issued iPad and we monitor it. However, your voice as the parent has the greatest influence in the life of your child. Your words and actions carry more weight than you may think.

There are many resources and sites for additional information on social media, its effects on children, and support for you to help them in their understanding. Here are just a few I found helpful. Working together we can help your child navigate these difficult years as they mature and grow toward responsible adulthood.
