





Beck To School Social

PBIS at DCMS

What is PBIS at DCMS?

Positive behavioral interventions and supports (PBIS) is a way for schools to encourage good behavior. With PBIS, schools teach kids about behavior, just as they would teach about other subjects like reading or math. The focus of PBIS is prevention, not punishment. We use the acronym "PROWL" to establish our expectations at DCMS. We use a digital ticketing system for awarding PBIS points. Students will earn points for excellent behavior and be able to purchase items and attend special events based on their earned points!

Students at DCMS are on the PROWL!

YouScience

YouScience is an online career and personal planning discovery tool that enables teens and adults to identify their potential aptitudes and careers. To create a personalized YouScience profile, the tool engages students in a series of online exercises to help them identify their natural abilities, refine their specific areas of interest. and explore career opportunities that are aligned with their interests and aptitudes. Sixth Grade Students will be taking the assessment on September 14ht and 16th. Ask your student what they learned about themselves and their future career interests! (YouScience, 2020)

1:1 Technology Expectations

- Students will be allowed to take their Ipads home after completing a digital citizenship course in the first 9 weeks and paying the 20.00 Technology Usage fee
- Ipads are used for educational purposes only. The ipad default settings should not be altered in any way.
 Technology infractions can result in disciplinary action including an office referral and loss of ipad privileges.
- Students are required to pay a 20.00 technology fee. This fee covers the cost of two repairs; subsequent repairs will result in a \$75 fee per repair.
- Intentional damage to the case is not a covered repair. Fees will be assessed in the amount of 95.00 for case damages. Stickers and or markings are not allowed on the cases.

DCMS Technology Usage Fees are sue September 4th!

This fee covers the cost of two repairs; subsequent repairs will result in a \$75 fee per repair.

- If the Technology Usage Fee is not submitted, a \$75 repair fee will be assessed for each repair on the device.
- The Technology Usage Fee does NOT cover intentional damage, neglect, abuse, improper care, loss, or theft of the <u>DEVICE</u>.
- If the device is found to be intentionally damaged beyond repair, the student will be assessed the full cost of the iPad
- The Technology Usage Fee does not cover intentional damage, neglect, abuse, improper care, loss, or theft of the <u>CASE</u>. <u>Case damages including markings or stickers will be assessed a damage fee of \$100.00. This is NOT covered by your tech fee.</u>
- All Technology Usage Fees are due no later than September 4, 2021.

 will post work in daily folders
 - Connections teachers will post work in a folder labeled "Quarantine Folder"
- Students should email the teacher through Schoology if they have any questions about their assignment or how to submit their work.
- Teacher's work hours are 7:00 3:00 Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.
- Teachers are available to answer and respond to emails and phone calls during their planning. Please allow 1 business day for teachers to respond.





ACADEMIC RIGOR

GOALS CONTINUED

On the Georgia Milestones, Level 3 is the proficient level at which all students should be achieving. As you can see by the data on the previous page, Dawson County Middle School students are performing above the state average, but there is still more work to be done to get more students to meeting the standard level of achievement. As a school we are dedicated to improving basic instruction and creating critical thinkers, as well as remediating skill deficits that we see within our students and our content areas in order to get our students to that proficient level. Teachers will be trained throughout the year on effective instructional strategies and differentiation techniques, in addition to increasing collaboration amongst grade levels and content areas.

The school has also increased the time students will spend in language arts and math classes. The additional 30 minutes a day will allow students more time to learn and process content, dig deeper into skills, and allow for more enrichment and/or remediation as needed. The goal of the increased class time is to better meet the needs of the students while we have them in our building, face to face.

In addition to increasing our scores in math and ELA, we want to embed more rigorous instruction into all



classrooms. This year we have the benefit of an instructional coach who will get into classrooms and meet one on one with teachers to meet their individual needs. Through coaching sessions, and peer observations, teachers will be able to embed more academically challenging lessons into their classrooms. Students also play an important role in helping us achieve our goal, by utilizing goal setting. In order for students to grow, they have to understand where they are and where they are going. We will be asking students to set high goals and share those goals with you within each of their classes.

THIS YEAR WE WANT TO IGNITE CREATIVITY, THINKING, AND PASSION....

Three days a week, during your child's tutorial class, we will be giving students time to "Ignite" their creativity, thinking, and passion for learning. There will be three areas of focus during "Ignite Time" and students will continuously rotate through all three, every three weeks, all year long. The three areas are:

- STEAM- STEAM education is the intentional integration of science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics.
 Teachers will create a student-centered learning environment in which students investigate and engineer solutions to
 problems, and construct evidence-based explanations of real-world phenomena with a focus on a student's social,
 emotional, physical, and academic needs. Students will be developing and creating projects that encompass
 agricultural skills (growing a garden), building rockets, egg drop, toothpick bridge, constructing a building and
 simulating an earthquake, and much more.
- 2. Genius Hour- Passions come alive during Genius Hour. This is a time for students to dive deep into a topic that they are interested in and develop a question for themselves to answer. This provides students with a choice and a time to learn. The teacher provides guidance, but ultimately this time encourages students to challenge themselves to work independently on their passion project. Passion projects will be presented to parents at the end of the school year.
- Novel Study- A novel study is an opportunity to build a love of reading. When done as a whole group, it can create a shared experience that builds communities and creates connections. Novel studies can also serve to give students exposure to different perspectives or experiences.
