 - b. Social Studies School-wide Fair 3 students advancing to state competition on April 13

- 4. Old Business
 - a. School Improvement Plan Update
 - i. Updated data on School Improvement Plan with Winter MAP data
 - 1. 6th Grade math scores predicting 2% above the school goal
 - 2. 7th Grade math scores predicting meeting the goal growth percentage of 3%
 - **3.** 6th Grade ELA scores currently 10% behind school. Winter MAP does have a historic drop and then increases again in spring.
 - 4. They are working to increase the stamina on assessments using Progress Learning to help support the students with building up the skill.
 - The lexile level of our students was shared and 57% of the 6th grade students and 53% of the 7th grade students are reading at or above the level the state expectation.
 - ii. School attendance is trending upward with an increase of 1% (currently at 93%) from the previous year
 - 1. Unexcused absences continue to represent the largest percentage of absences
 - 2. Parents are submitting notes and attendance is being updated accordingly
 - 3. School Attendance Support Team is connecting with parents to improve attendance concerns

- iii. School discipline for 6th grade is trending upward.
 - 1. 6th grade discipline is significantly trending upward
 - a. Increase is tied to students with multiple infractions
 - 2. 7th grade discipline is slightly increasing
 - 3. In School Suspension has increased while Out of School Suspensions and Alternative School Placement has decreased
 - Location of discipline issues has decreased on the bus and in the restrooms. Classroom discipline referrals have increased with the largest percentage of infraction occurring between the hours of 8AM - 10AM.

- Review of Dawson County Schools American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act ESSER III-LEA Application
 - i. The Middle School is receiving the federal funds in the following ways:
 - 1. Summer School program with adaptive curriculum and support for SWD's.
 - Online Learning-Some of the criteria for the middle school is that students have less than 10 unexcused absences and are passing every class. Students must maintain a passing grade in order to remain online, otherwise they will be required to come back to face-to-face instruction.
